WHAT MADE ME PURSUE ART AS A CAREER by Lynn Creighton



My original university training prepared me to teach. By the time I was ready to step into the classroom, my own children had priority over a full day of other people's children. My interest shifted to fulfilling an early dream: I returned to the university to learn how to work with clay. After a trip to Japan where I observed Shoji Hamada using a paddle to refine the feet of his teacups, I made my own paddles from a tree downed on my property. The response of the clay to the energy of the paddle opened possibilities for form way beyond the cylindrical results on the potter's wheel. I had found a way to engage with clays magical potential to find form.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

My journey into Native American transformational ceremonies opened me to a deeper level of my own knowing. Clay has allowed me to reveal in form what I have come to know. EMERGENCE was my first series, revealing in form the drama of life becoming visible to itself as the single celled life expanded and engaged with the world around it. RECLAIMING THE SACRED SOURCE are female figures emerging from the paddle-stimulated clay as women remembering to celebrate life at the core of their being which occurred after women prayed in the purification lodge to overcome the trauma of sexual abuse. My latest series, LOVE, WHATS IT TO YA and WHERE IS LOVE express in clay the importance of love in holding life together.

What ACCOMPLISHMENT AM I MOST PROUD OF

I feel satisfied that my journey through life has allowed me to focus on an important issue and contribute to its resolution. I have shown in image how life can be celebrated by the given mechanisms of sexuality and how life at its core is about love. 
Kitchen Tours
